- Project Deliverables (proposal documents, milestone reports detailing baseline mapping)
- Documentation (user guides, methodological protocols for baseline data collection)
- Other Research Outputs (lab notebooks, collaborative workflows, experiment logs)




HOW TO CONTRIBUTE
