- **Datasets** (experimental data, observational data, survey results)
- Software & Tools (code repositories, automation scripts for baseline data analysis)
- Presentations (conference slides, poster sessions, workshop materials)
- Multimedia (videos, audio files, explanatory tutorials)
- Reports & Policy Briefs (technical reports, policy notes focusing on baseline assessments)
- Theses & Dissertations (chapters or full research relevant to baseline indicators)
- Images & Infographics (figures, maps, GIS layers illustrating resource distribution)
- Training/Educational Resources (manuals, lecture notes on data collection, baseline setting)
- Project Deliverables (proposal documents, milestone reports detailing baseline mapping)
- **Documentation** (user guides, methodological protocols for baseline data collection)
- Other Research Outputs (lab notebooks, collaborative workflows, experiment logs)
